DR. VINCENT S. PALMISANO (August 11)

Funeral services were held for Dr. Vincent S. Palmisano, M.D., formerly of Runnemede and Cherry Hill passed away peacefully surrounded by family members on July 28, 2016 in Bluffton, South Carolina. He was 101.

He was a skilled and compassionate physician, a decorated World War II veteran and above all a man who loved and lived for his family and serving his community and country.

He was predeceased by his beloved wife of 67 years, Charlotte Harman Palmisano who died in 2008. Dr. Palmisano is survived by his three daughters: Elsalyn Palmisano and her husband Dr. Harris Drucker of Tinton Falls, N.J., Janice Harman Palmisano of Gulfport, Fla., and Elaine Florence Palmisano and her husband Cary Holland of Bluffton, S.C.; and by three grandsons, David P. Drucker and his wife Amy, Jason P. Drucker and his partner, Joseph Ortiz, and Vincent M. Colvin and his wife Michelle; two great-grandsons, Dylan K. and Charlie K. Drucker and his sister, Elizabeth Palmisano of Seminole, Fla.

Vincent's father was of Sicilian descent studying art in Munich where he met his wife whose father was a noted German physician. Vincent was born in Munich on June 1, 1915 and immigrated to America with his parents at the age of six settling in Sunbury, Pa. He graduated from Sunbury High School, Pa., in 1933 and from Bucknell University in 1937 where he was a member of Delta Phi Alpha. After graduation he attended Thomas Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, class of 1941 and interned at Methodist Episcopal Hospital in Philadelphia, finishing in 1942. From 1938 to 1941 he was a member of Alpha Kappa Kappa, the medical fraternity. He met his future wife, Charlotte, on a blind date during his time there. They married February 27, 1941. She was the love of his life and his soul mate, for 67 years.

During World War II he served as a Captain in the Medical Corps of the United States Army with the 104th Infantry Division in 1941 transferring eventually to the 6th Armored Division under General Patton. He was awarded the bronze star for meritorious service while with the 76th medical battalion participating in campaigns in Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes, Rhineland, and Central Germany. He was awarded the European Theater Campaign ribbon with 5 battle stars and was honorably discharged from the Army as a major in 1952.

Following military service he established a family practice in Runnemede, N.J. for forty years (1946-1986), first on 6th Avenue, then on the Black Horse Pike. He prospered as a sole practitioner and was dedicated to his patients both

during office visits and regular "house calls". He had a measured pace that reassured and comforted his patients. While his daughters were at Triton Regional School from 1957-1970 in Runnemede he was the school physician. As a member of the Runnemede-Bellmawr-Glendora Rotary Club over 25 years he also served as its President in 1975. In the early years of his practice he received certification from the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Medicine for Internal Medicine.

He and his wife were active members of the Unitarian Universalist Church in Cherry Hill for over 60 years. Upon his retirement from his medical practice in 1986 they moved to a townhouse in Cherry Hill where he continued to live until after his 100th birthday in 2015 when he moved to be near his youngest daughter in South Carolina.

He had an impressive career both educationally and professionally, receiving various honors and awards. In 1991 he received the Golden Merit Award from the Medical Society of N.J. upon 50 years of distinguished service as a practicing physician. Also the Alumni Association of Jefferson recognized him for "50 years of faithful medical service in traditional ideals of the medical profession." Awards followed from the Camden County Medical Society, the American Medical Association, and the American Academy of Family Physicians where he was made a charter fellow in 1972 after joining in 1951. He was President of the Camden County Chapter. In October of 1998 he was a recipient of the State of New Jersey Distinguished Service Medal for exceptional meritorious service in Armed Forces of U.S. Veterans and was a founding member of the National Museum of the U.S. Army in Fort Belvoir, Virginia. Through his hundreds of charitable donations over the years he was awarded countless honorary memberships.

Vincent had many interests including a lifelong dedication to scouting. He was a member of the Boy Scouts of America Troop 9 in Sunbury, Pa. attaining the rank of Eagle Scout with Palms and a member of Order of the Arrow-Lodge. He always enjoyed gardening, reading, bicycling, tennis, sailing his boat the "Three Sisters", traveling to the Jersey Shore and Florida and visiting historic sites with his family. A man of remarkable warmth, curiosity, and knowledge, Vincent's family always came first.
